### **AfriWatSan Stakeholders Dissemination Workshop: 8-9 January 2020**

We had a successful stakeholders meeting on 8<sup>th</sup> to 9<sup>th</sup> January 2020 in Masaka at Brovad Hotel with an aim to disseminate the study findings and interact with the stakeholders. The programme included a one day workshop followed by a field tour of the study sites on day 2. The participants included the Makerere Afriwatsan research team (PIs, Students and Technicians) and the stakeholders including; Local Council members, Village Health Teams, Civil servants (District and Town Council water engineers, Health inspectors, In-charges of health units, Heads of institutions) and, private investors of Kalungu district and Lukaya Town Council.

Day 1: 8<sup>th</sup> January 2020 presentations by the Afriwatsan Team-Makerere and Day 2: 9<sup>th</sup> January 2020 field tour to the study site as per the attached program (Appendix 1)

- The workshop was interactive involving the use of both the local language (Luganda) and English so that every attendee was able to participate.
- The stakeholders were very much interested in understanding the results of the study and they actively shared their experiences on practices and management of their water sources and sanitation systems.

#### **Key outputs, decisions and ways forward**

- The civil servants were not aware of all the existing water sources and their conditions in the area and, the management and practices used by the residents, e.g. the desludging methods.
- Many stakeholders were not aware of the quality of the water they use.
- Civil servants promised to close all the water sources that were highly faecally contaminated and to enforce the installation of deep wells as per the Government's programme.
